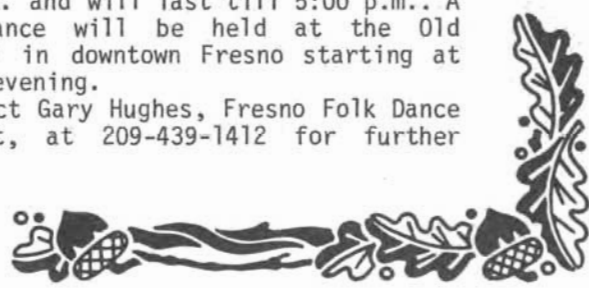
Dancing exhibitions will be presented both days and all program and request dancing are FREE! Ethnic food will be available throughout the festival activities, starting at Noon, on Saturday.

## ARKADAS TURKISH FOLK ENSEMBLE



"Arkadas Turkish Folk Ensemble" will present its Third Annual Balkan and Turkish Folklore Night, October 17, 1987 in the San Jose University Music Concert Hall, Music Building, 7th and Carlos Streets, in San Jose at 7:00 p.m..

Arkadas, a word translated to mean "Friend", hosts this Balkan-Turkish night with the objective of uniting through friendship, dance and culture, these traditionally divided communities. Their annual program is unprecedented for including Turkish, Greek, Bulgarian, Yugoslavian and Romanian artists on the same venue.


Dancing will be performed by Westwind Folk Dance Ensemble, Slavonijo Kolo, Pat and Pistu Papp, Ionian Dancers and the Arkadas Ensemble. Music will be presented by Ismail & Armando, Kaba Vence, Kitka, Salih Baba and Melissa Miller.

Musicians will also play for the International Folk Dance Party which is planned to take place in the Women's Gym following the Exhibition..


Arkadas has recently been honored by being invited to dance in this summer's San Francisco Ethnic Dance Festival, being chosen as the only Turkish group in the Festival's nine year history. An authentic, interesting and exciting variety of dances will be performed including the fast paced "Silifke," complicated rhythms of the "Artvin" steps, graceful and silent dances from the Kars regions with colorful costumes of the Gaziantep area.

Last April Arkadas presented its program of Turkish dances with its rich and varied heritage, at the Ninth Annual Lubbock, Texas Arts Festival. They were sponsored by Texas Tech University Cultural Exchange Committee of the University Center Programs in conjunction with a local Turkish-American Association and the Archive of Turkish Oral Narrative. Also

Arkadas will be performing at the 1988 Australian Expo having been seen at the 1987 Expo in Vancouver, Canada.



Arkadas has been under the artistic direction of Omer Uyuklu for the past ten years. He conducts folk dance workshops periodically throughout the United States.

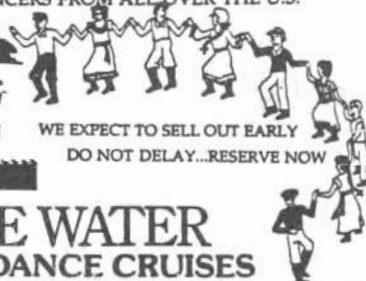

# Marin-Congo

(France)

Marin-Congo (mah-RAN kohn-GOH) is a progressive dance from Gasconne in southwestern France. Marilyn Wathen learned it there in the summer of 1986 and presented it at the 1987 University of the Pacific Folk Dance Camp.

CASSETTE: On Y Va Side B/1

2/4 meter

FORMATION: Cpls in a single circle, ptrs facing each other with hands down at sides. M face LOD (CCW), W face RLOD (CW).

STYLING: Steps are flat and smooth - no bouncing. Knees are always slightly bent.

Ftwk same for M and W.

MUSIC 2/4

PATTERN

Measures

1 long note INTRODUCTION No action.

- 1 Step fwd on L twd ptr (ct 1); step on R beside L (ct &); step on L in place (ct 2).
- 2 Step diag R bkwd on R ft (ct 1); step on L beside R (ct &); step on R a little fwd of L (ct 2).
- 3 Starting to make a CCW turn, step fwd on L into ptrs place, passing L shldr (ct 1); continuing the turn, step on R beside L (ct &); step on L in place, completing a full turn CCW (ct 2). End in a single circle with back to orig ptr and facing a new ptr. M still face LOD, W RLOD.

NOTE: Most of the turning occurs on ct 1. Ptrs should keep eye contact with each other as long as possible during the turn.

- 4 In place, step R,L,R (cts 1,&,2).

DANCE SEQUENCE: Dance pattern as written with a new ptr each time.

# Plataniótiko Neró

(Greece)

Plataniótiko Neró (plah-tah-NYEEOH-tee-koh neh-ROH) means "Water from the Sycamore Tree" which the song lyrics tell us will cure all pain. This dance belongs to the Island Syrtós or Ballós family of Greek dance. It comes from the Aegean island of Sámos and is similar to the Syrtós Haniótikos or Kritikós but begins with the opposite foot. It is also know as Syrtós from Sámos.

The dance was presented by Stephen Kotansky at the 1986 University of the Pacific Folk Dance Camp. His sources were Elefteris Drandakis and Margarethe Mahkorn.

FORMATION: Open circle of dancers with leader at right end. Hands joined in "W" pos, held fwd at chest level. Dancers stand close to each other, all facing ctr.

INTRODUCTION A 30 second solo played on the santuri which is a type of dulcimer played with small hammers.

- 1 Step fwd on L (ct 1); touch ball of R in front of L (ct 2).
- 2 Backing up diag R, step back on R (ct 1); step back on L(ct 2); step back on R (ct &).
- 3 Step back on L (ct 1); moving sdwd to R, step to R on R (ct 2); step on L beside R (ct &).
- 4 Step on R to R (ct 1); moving twd ctr, step fwd on L (ct 2); step on R beside L (ct &).

## VARIATION

Starting on meas 2, ct 2 the leader can change places with the second dancer by stepping L,R,L across in front of the second dancer who must angle more to the R to accomodate. During the next sequence they may change back.

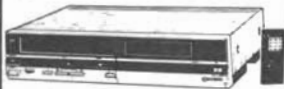
