## Skandia Dancers Perform at Statewide '93



Those who do not attend Statewide in the south will miss sights such as is shown in the accompanying picture -- even more beautiful in color and in person, of course! The '91 dance concert marked the debut of the Skandia Dancers' women's costumes from Finland and of the group's Finnish suite, directed by Donna Tripp (far left). Most of the costumes are family heirlooms donated by individual citizens of Finland, and others were acquired through a grant from the Finlandia Foundation, all this through the efforts of Anja Miller (far right).

Concert Director Richard Duree reports that there will be eight varied groups on this year's program. Skandia is returning with multi-Scandinavian dances. Polskie Iskry has something new and different in the works—we hope it's Polish! Dunaj's presentation is from the Kalotaszeg region of Transylvania

For a dash of spice, the Arpana Dance Company brings a 2000-year tradition from southern India, the Bharata Natvam form of dance.

Then it's off to Argentina to see the tango, exquisitely interpreted by professional dancers Alberto Toledano and Loreen Arbus.

The other three groups which have been invited represent three different continents, in keeping with the Federation South's goal of greater cultural diversity.

Another goal is for folk dancing to be an activity which bridges across generations. Thus there is a bargain admission at the door for junior high and high school students. And children below that age get a free passport to the entire weekend. Bring a kid to Statewide! Call it a Finnishing school.

## Brîul de la Făgăraș (Romania)

Briul de la Fagaras (brr-OOL deh lah fuh-guh-RAHSH) was presented at the 1970 San Francisco Kolo Festival by Sunni Bloland. Fagaras is a town in the western part of Judet (county) Brasov in southern Transylvania. This dance belongs to the category of Carpathian Brlu diffused among the villages situated along the roads which the shepherds took each year to the grazing grounds of the Danube meadows and Dobrogea. The simpler variants, including this dance from Fagaras, are done by both men and women, although the high leaps and leg gestures indicate a predominantly masculine styling.

RECORD:

NOROC 1074-EPA, 331/3 RPM, side B/4.

RHYTHM:

8/8 meter, counted: 1/4 note = S, 1/8 note = Q. The rhythm for each figure is shown on the line

with the title; parentheses indicate measures.

FORMATION: Short mixed lines in T-pos. Face slightly R of ctr.

STYLING:

During more than twenty years since this dance was first presented in California, there has been a tendency for both the rhythm and styling to stray. The grapevines in Figures I and III should

have a prancing feeling, with dancers facing slightly R of center. The leader at the right end of

the line should not face more directly in LOD.

**MUSIC** 

8/8 meter

**PATTERN** 

Measures

INTRODUCTION None in the music. The name of the dance is announced.

I. STAMP-STEP AND GRAPEVINE

(Q, S, S, Q, S)

- Facing slightly R of ctr and moving in LOD (CCW), stamp R in LOD without wt (Q); step R in 1 LOD with accent (S); leap on L behind R, flipping R ft high across in front of L, so that lower R leg is parallel to the floor (S); leap on R in LOD (Q); step L in front of R (S).
- 2-8 Repeat meas 1 seven times.
  - II. HOP-TOUCH FACING CENTER

(S, S, Q, Q, S) (Q, S, S, Q, S)

- Hopping on L in place and swinging straight R leg fwd across L, touch R toe to floor (S); 1 hopping on L in place and swinging straight R leg to R, touch R toe to floor to R side (S); moving slightly fwd, hop on L and swing R leg fwd slightly raised (Q); step fwd on R (Q); step back onto L as R kicks fwd low (S).
- Hop on L, raising bent R knee and moving bkwd (Q); step back onto R (S); step back onto L 2 (S); step fwd on R (Q); step fwd on L (S).
- 3-8 Repeat meas 1-2 three times.

#### III. HOP-CLICKS AND GRAPEVINE

(S, S, Q, Q, S) (Q, S, S, Q, S)

- Facing slightly R of ctr and moving in LOD, hop on L, clicking side of R ft to L (S); repeat hop-click (S); hop on L (Q); step R to R (Q); step L across in front of R (S).
- 2 Repeat Figure I, meas 1.
- 3-8 Repeat meas 1-2 three times.

#### IV. HOP-SWINGS

(S, S, S, S) (Q, S, S, Q, S)

- Facing ctr, hop on L in place and swing straight R leg across in front of L (S); hop on L in place and swing straight R leg diag fwd R (S); hop on L in place, bending R knee and swinging R ft behind L knee (S); hop on L in place and swing straight R leg diag fwd R (S).
- 2 Repeat Figure II, meas 2.
- 3-8 Repeat meas 1-2 three times.

DANCE SEQUENCE: Dance pattern as written twice.

#### FRANCE

There are two main areas of French cooking. The first is haute cuisine, practised since the beginning by a few very distinguished chefs, but now more often by leading restaurants or hotels. The second is the provincial or bourgeous cooking.

#### POTAGE PARMENTIER \*

4 Tbls butter

2 Tbls vegetable oil

1 large onion, finely chopped

3 medium leeks (white parts only)
finely chopped

6 medium potatões, finely chopped Salt and pepper to taste

3-3/4 cups chicken stock

1-1/4 cups milk

Melt the butter and oil in a large saucepan. Add the onion and fry until it is soft. Stir in the leeks and potatoes and cook until the potatoes are evenly browned, stirring occasionally. Season with salt and pepper and pour in the stock and milk. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Reduce the heat to low. Cover the pan and simmer for 25 minutes, or until potatoes are tender.

Pour the soup through a strainer, rubbing the vegetables through. Discard the pulp in the strainer, or puree the soup in a blender.

Return the soup to the saucepan and simmer for 5 minutes. Serve at once.

4 to 6 servings.

\*By chilling the soup over ice and serving it cold, it becomes *Vichyssoise*.

### ESCARGOTS A LA BOURGUIGNONNE (Snails with Garlic Butter)

12 Tbls softened butter

2 Tbls finely chopped parsley

2 garlic cloves, crushed Salt and pepper to taste

2 Tbls brandy

24 Smail shells

24 Canned Snails, drained

Preheat the oven to 375°.

Cream the butter, parsley, garlic and seasoning together. Add half the brandy and beat until the mixture is soft and smooth.

Using a teaspoon, push a little of the butter mixture into each snail shell. Then push a snail into each shell; seal the entrance with a little more of the butter mixture.

Place the snails into a shallow ovenproof dish and dribble the remaining brandy over the snails. Put the dish into the oven and bake for 15 to 20 minutes, or until the butter is bubbling and beginning to brown. Serve at once. Serves 4.

## MOUSSE AU CHOCOLAT (Chocolate Mousse)

8 squares semi-sweet chocolate, broken.
into small pieces

3 Tbls strong black coffee

3 Tbls unsalted butter, cut into small pieces

4 eggs, separated

2 Tbls Brandy

Combine the chocolate and coffee in a heat-proof bowl. Put the bowl over a saucepan half-filled with hot water and set the pan over moderately low heat. Cook the mixture, beating constantly with a wooden spoon, until the chocolate has melted and the mixture is smooth.

Beat in the butter, a few pieces at a time, and continue beating until blended. Add the egg yolks and cook, beating constantly, for 5 minutes, or until the mixture has thickened and is smooth. Do not let the mixture come to a boil.

Remove the pan from the heat and the bowl from the pan. Stir in the brandy and set the mixture aside for 30 minutes to cool completely.

Beat the egg whites until they form stiff peaks. Quickly fold the egg whites into the chocolate mixture.

Spoon the mousse into individual serving glasses and chill for 4 hours, or overnight.




