


President's Message

Our Federation activities for 1993 have started and, there are many good events scheduled. From the looks of our annual calendar - this month it's the Festival of the Oaks in Oakland, February 21st, at Edna M. Brewer Jr. High School Gym, 1:30 to 5:30 p.m. There will be a BOARD MEETING at ll a.m., followed by an ASSEMBLY MEETING at 11:45 a.m. Please be sure to send me a report of any matters that need the approval of the Board.

At our October meeting in Fresno, Bev Wilder, made mention of the Civic Center Act which would allow folk dancers certain privileges concerning meeting places. Michael Norris checked in the West's Law Books, current issues through 1992, and this is an outline of what is available. ALL COUNCIL PRESIDENTS and FOLK DANCE GROUPS should take note of this information and if you are interested, we will provide a copy of the code.

"Community Colleges are directed in the Educational Code to allow the use of facilities under their control to non-profit organizations, (folk and square dancing are specifically mentioned), with a charge which reimburses them for no more than custodian fees for opening and closing the facility and during the organization's use of the facility, cost of janitorial services needed only for the organization's function and the cost of utilities of the facility used. Contributions may be asked at the door for charitable purposes or with the governing board of the Community College allowing the non-profit organization to do so because their contributions are for the support of the organization itself or for the advancement of folk dancing. In the Government Code, cities and/or counties which have properties devoted to park, amusement, or recreational purposes may charge for use or services, (which can not exceed the cost of the service provided). Charges for similar uses or services are to be uniform to the extent feasible."

Hope this information will help those groups having difficulty in finding places to dance.

The Fresno F.D. Council has made contact with their local Public Broadcasting TV Station advising they are ready to assist in the scheduled AMERICA DANCING series, set for April and May. Looking forward to hearing from the Councils about plans they have made concerning the International Folk Dance Weekend Nov. 13th & 14th, endorsed by Federations North and South.

See you all at the February 21st festival and meeting in Oakland.





GERMANY

German cooking is heavy, fat and substantial. The dominant element of most regional dishes is pork, always highly spiced. Potatoes are its constant companion.

ENTE mit ÄPFELN und BROT FÜLLUNG (Roast Duck with Apple and Bread Stuffing)

1 4-1/2 to 5 pound duck Salt

Freshly ground black pepper 3/4 pound lean ground beef (chuck) 3/4 pound lean ground pork legg, lightly beaten 1/2 cup dried bread crumbs

1/2 teaspoon marjoram

2 medium-sized apples, peeled, cored and cut into 1/2" cubes

Preheat oven to 425°. Wash the duck under cold rumming water and pat dry with paper towels. Rub the inside of the duck with salt and pepper. For crisper skin, prick the surface of the duck around the thighs, the back, and the lower part of the breast.

In a large bowl, combine the beef, pork, egg, crumbs, marjoram, I teaspoon of salt and a few grindings of pepper. Knead vigorously with both hands until the ingredients are well blended. Stir in the apples and spoon the stuffing loosely into the cavity. Close the opening with skewers, and truss the bird securely.

Roast the duck, breast side up on a rack set in a large shallow pan, for 20 minutes, until it browns. Pour off the fat from the roasting pan. Reduce the heat to 350° and roast for about an hour longer, removing the accumulated fat occasionally.

To test for doneness, pierce the thigh of the bird with the tip of a small, sharp knife. The juice should

spurt out a clear yellow.

Transfer the duck to a heated platter and let it rest for 10 minutes before carving. Traditionally the duck is accompanied by red cabbage and dumplings.

ROTKOHL mit ÄPFELN (Red Cabbage with Apples)

1 2-1/2 pound Red Cabbage 2/3 cup red wine vinegar

2 tablespoons sugar

2 teaspoons salt

2 tablespoons bacon fat

2 medium-sized cooking apples, peeled, cored and cut into 1/8" thick wedges

1/2 cup finely chopped onions

1 whole onion, peeled and pierced with 2 whole cloves

1 small bay leaf

5 cups boiling water

3 tablespoons dry red wine

3 tablespoons red currant jelly

Cut the cabbage into quarters and shred into 1/8" wide strips. Drop the cabbage into a large mixing bowl, and sprinkle it with the vinegar, sugar and salt. Toss the shreds about to coat them with the mixture.

In a heavy 5 quart casserole, melt the bacon fat over moderate heat. Add the apples and chopped onions and cook, stirring frequently, for 5 minutes, until the apples are lightly browned. Add the cabbage, the whole onion with cloves, and the bay leaf; stir thoroughly and pour in the boiling water. Bring to a boil over high heat, stirring occasionally, and reduce the heat to low. Cover and simmer for 1-1/2 to 2 hours, until the cabbage is tender.

Just before serving remove the onion and bay leaf, and stir in the wine and the current jelly. Transfer the entire contents of the casserole to a heated bowl and serve.

Serves 4 to 6


