
President's Message, South

La Salamandre (lah sah-lah-MAHNDR) is a couple dance from Alsace. The name probably derived from "Alamander" or "Alaman." Germain Hébert learned the dance from Solange Denni at the Heritage '88 International Festival, Cornwall, Canada. Germain presented the dance at the 1992 North-South Teacher's Seminar and again at the 1993 University of the Pacific Folk Dance Camp.





The Candles of Paradise






