

Grand Ball 1995



SOCIAL DANCING

The following was reprinted from January 1994 Mayo Clinic Health Letter, with permission of Mayo Foundation for Medical Education and Research, Rochester, Minnesota 55905.

Jazz up your fitness routine with a regular dose of dance.

Evelyn resolved that in 1994 she'd exercise regularly. But it's only the beginning of the new year and she's already bored with her new stationary bike. The rowing machine and treadmill at the YWCA also hold little appeal.

When a friend coaxed her to go along for an evening of free dance lessons, she realized exercise doesn't have to be a chore.

It's true. Whether you're swirling across the floor to a Strauss waltz or doing do-si-dos to the commands of a square dance caller, you're getting exercise -- and probably having fun too.

Dancing pairs you up with more than a partner.

From burning calories to socializing with friends, dancing offers these health benefits:

Calories - Dancing can burn as many calories as walking, swimming or riding a bicycle. During a half hour
of sustained dancing you can burn between 200 and 400 calories.

One factor that determines how many calories you'll expend is distance. In one study, researchers attached pedometers to square dancers and found each person covered nearly five miles in a single evening.

 Cardiovascular conditioning – Regular exercise can lead to a slower heart rate, lower blood pressure and an improved cholesterol profile.

Experts typically recommend 30 to 40 minutes of continuous activity three to four times a week. Dancing may not provide all the conditioning you need, but it can help. The degree of cardiovascular conditioning depends on how vigorously you dance, how long you dance continuously and how regularly you do it.

- Strong bones The side to side movements of many dances strengthen your weight bearing bones (tibia, fibula and femur) and can help prevent or slow loss of bone mass (osteoporosis).
- Rehabilitation If you're recovering from heart or knee surgery, movement may be part of your rehabilitation. Dancing is a positive alternative to aerobic dance or jogging.
- Sociability Dancing contains a social component that solitary fitness endeavors don't. It gives you an
 opportunity to develop strong social ties which contribute to self-esteem and a positive outlook.

Would you like to dance?

Tomorrow night when you consider settling down for a little television, turn on the music instead. After a few spins around the living room, you'll have so much fun you may forget you're exercising.

Trei păzește de la Măceșu Romania

Trei păzește de la Măceșu (TRAY puh-ZESH-teh deh lah muh-CHEH-shoo) is from the village of Măceșu very near to Goicea in Oltenia. In this popular generic dance form the title means "three times, attention!", a warning to the dancers that the next step will be difficult or tricky. The dance was taught by Theodor Vasilescu at the '95 Stockton Folk Dance Camp.

Cassettes: Theodor Vasilescu: Romanian Folk Dances, Stockton 1995 Side A/7; California Tour 1995 Side A/5.

2/4 meter

- Formation: Mixed open circle, hands joined in V-pos, or lines with hands joined in front basket hold, L over R.
- Styling: As is traditional, Vasilescu often shouted counts and words of encouragement during the dance. The following, offered here in parentheses at the ends of some measures, are suggestions; there is no obligation to use them.

PATTERN

- 8 meas <u>INTRODUCTION</u> No action.
 - I. HEEL STEPS TO CENTER AND SCUFFS TO RIGHT AND LEFT
 - 1-4 Facing and moving twd ctr, step fwd on R heel (ct 1); step on L near R heel (ct &); step fwd on R with accent (ct 2) (una). Repeat measure three times, alternating ftwk (două, trei, patru).
 - 5 Facing and moving in LOD, step on R (ct 1); scuff L heel fwd beside R (ct &); repeat cts 1,& with opp ftwk (cts 2,&) (haide, haide).
 - 6 Step in LOD on R (ct 1); scuff L heel fwd beside R (ct &); pivoting to face ctr, raise L leg fwd with knee bent (ct 2); stamp L beside R without wt (ct &).
 - 7-8 Repeat meas 5,6 with opp ftwk and direction (haide, haide).
 - II. STAMPS TO RIGHT AND LEFT
 - 1 Facing ctr and moving in LOD, step on R to R (ct 1); step on L across behind R (ct &); step on R to R (ct 2); stamp L beside R, no wt (ct &) (iausi una).
 - 2 Moving in RLOD step on L to L (ct 1); step on R across behind L (ct &); step on L to L (ct 2).
 - 3 Stamp R twice beside L, no wt (cts 1,2) (hei, hei).
 - 4-8 Repeat meas 1-3; then repeat meas 1,2 (iausi două, hei, hei, iausi trei).

III. PIVOT TURNS AND TRAVEL IN RLOD

- 1 Facing ctr, step fwd on R (ct 1); step back on L, pivoting 1/4 CCW to face RLOD (ct 2) (una).
- 2-4 Repeat meas 1 three times, turning 1/4 CCW each time to end facing ctr (doua, trei, patru). Join hands when facing twd or away from ctr; release hands when facing LOD or RLOD.
- 5 Facing ctr and moving in RLOD, step on R heel across in front of L (ct 1) (una); step on L behind R with accent (ct &); repeat cts 1,& (cts 2,&) (două).
- 6 Repeat meas 5, cts 1,& (cts 1,&) (trei); step on R across in front of L (ct 2) (patru); turning to face ctr, raise L leg slightly and bring it fwd (ct &).

IV. LEAPS AND STAMPS

- Facing ctr, leap vigorously fwd onto L, bending both knees and bringing raised R leg in an arc around to the front (ct 1) (una); step on R across in front of L (ct 2); step back on L (ct &).
- 2 Step on R beside L (ct 1); step on L across in front of R (ct &); step back on R, bending both knees as L leg is raised in front (ct 2).
- 3 Repeat meas 1 (două).
- 4 Repeat meas 2, cts 1,& (cts 1,&); step on R to R (ct 2); step on L beside R (ct &).
- 5 Facing ctr and keeping L ft in place, stamp R diag fwd L with wt (ct 1); step back on L with accent (ct &); step on R beside L with accent (ct 2); step on L beside R with accent (ct &).
- 6 Repeat meas 5.
- 7 Repeat meas 5, cts 1,& (cts 1,&); moving bkwd away from ctr, step R, L (cts 2,&).
- 8 Repeat meas 7, cts 2,& (cts 1,&); step on R with accent, bending both knees and raising L leg fwd.
- 9 Brush L ft back, then fwd (cts 1,2).
- 10 Bending both knees, leap onto L bringing raised R leg fwd in a CCW arc (ct 1); step on R across in front of L (ct &); step back on L, bending knees and facing ctr with R leg raised fwd (ct 2).
- SEQUENCE: Dance pattern three times as written; then repeat Figure I, meas 1-4 (una, două, trei, patru); end by stamping R fwd (meas 5, cts 1,2) (cinci).

LEGACY RESOLUTIONS DEAL WITH YOUNGER DANCERS

Among the resolutions passed at the LEGACY meeting in 1995, one concerning the "Future of Square Dancing" arose from concern over the need to acquaint youth and young adults with the fun of square dancing. A two-year task force reported on its findings at the meeting, noting that where youth clubs exist, they are strong because of the support they receive from their callers (a parent or a young friend) and from parents. In many areas no opportunity to dance exists for young people. A few clubs allow younger dancers to join, but the published list is very limited.

She served the Federation as a member of the Research Committee, writing dance descriptions.

We haven't seen much of Pearl in the last few years which shouldn't be surprising in view of the fact that she was ninety-one years old when she died. We miss her and will continue to miss her; she made a sizeable contribution to folk dancing.

If you needed a calendar Theda Mary had plenty of the Folk Dance Federation calendars, also bumper stickers. From time to time she was called on to lead a kolo ог teach a dance. and She was always ready to help where she could, but never made any noise about what she did for the folk dance movement.--Ben Armentrout.



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PAUL PRITCHARD 1916 - 1995

A few days before christmas our friend Paul Pritchard passed away at age 79 from prostate cancer. He was editor of Folk Dance Scene for many years (17?) - in fact, his name was synonymous with that magazine. In the early days he was an active member of the International Dance Circle (IDC), the Gandy Dancers, was president of the Westwood Co-operative Dancers, and last but not least president of the Folk Dance Federation, 1956-57. Paul was a lifelong enthusiast of folk dancing and wherever he went he made a lasting contribution.

Folk Dance Scene was started by Bill Rosenthal, to serve as a little news letter about dance events in the South. When Bill left, Paul became editor and through him it became the folk magazine of the southland. The magazine was always filled with chatty goings on about events in the folk dance world. Of fond remembrance were the costume stamps which appeared in every issue. A fun magazine, it was full of news and notices of events. It was a delight to read and it attained its largest circulation under his guiding hand. His gentle writing and his scene of humor was a delight to all.

Paul also had a regular column in Let's Dance Magazine in which he chronicled events in the south.

Paul was one of the founders of the Gandy Dancers. Legend has it that it was founded over a wine breakfast up the Malibu coast. Probably a tall tale. At any rate with Paul and others, the Gandy Dancers became one of the leading exhibition groups in the south - giving exhibitions from Sacramento to Ensenada (yes, they went international!). Paul was also active in another group: the International Dance Circle under the leadership of Paul Erfer. Almost forgotten today, this group introduced many fine dances into the Federation repertoire.

In spite of these activities, Paul held down a full time job as a photo engraver and raised a family. He is survived by that family - his wife Joan of 32 years and his two sons, Evan and Hugh. The family asked that no one phone them or send cards, but if they wished to do something that they send donations in Paul's memory to the Folk Dance Federation of CA, So., and request that it be put into the Valerie Staigh Scholarship Fund.

In closing, let us not mourn Paul, but rather let us celebrate his many fine accomplishments - let us remember a clever and talented man.
