


Where is Rocklin? and Where do we dance?

Directions to Rocklin

When entering the Sacramento area, follow all signs that lead you to Interstate 80 and Reno. You will pass through Sacramento and Roseville. You will exit to the right on Rocklin Road. DO NOT TAKE THE ROCKLIN/TAYLOR exit which comes before Rocklin Road. Turn left under the freeway and continue to the sites listed below.

WHERE DO WE DANCE?

HOTEL: The star on the map is the location of the Howard Johnson Inn (4420 Rocklin Rd.) This is the Federation Headquarters for the festival Inn/Hotel Information is on the back of this page.

FRIDAY: #1 on your map is the location of the Finnish Temperance Hall. The openin "Fandango" will also include the Ice Cream Social.

SATURDAY: #2 on your map is the site of the Spring View Middle School. The Institute, "Gold Rush" dancing, and the after party with "Vecernica" will be here. Dick Crum's presentation will be in the Sierra. Quarry rooms at the Hote.

SUNDAY: The Installation Brunch will be at the Hotel #3 on the map is the location of the Concert at the City of Rocklin Sunset Center (2650 Sunset). Both the Bar-B-Q and the "Tailings" dance will be at the Rocklin Community Center, #4 on the map.

Andulička

(Czech Republic)

Andulička (AHN-doo-leech-kah) is a non-partner dance from around the city of Karlovy Vary, Karlovarsko ethnic region, in western Bohemia. Like other "kolos", this dance has just a few figures that are repeated in various combinations. In this case there are four 8-measure figures. The title of this dance is a girl's name (similar to Annie), and the song tells about the tribulations of marriage. This dance was taught by Radek Rejšek and Eva Rejšková at the University of the Pacific Stockton Folk Dance Camp 2001, and at a workshop for the Berkelev Folk Dancers (July 19, 2001).

Cassette:

Dances from the Czech Republic, Stockton Folk Dance Camp 2001, A/7.

2/4 meter

Formation: Dancers in closed circle, hands joined in V-pos.

Steps and Styling:

Dvoipolka (double-polka): In this dance, this step is done only in RLOD (CW), facing L of ctr. Touch R heel fwd on floor while bouncing on L heel (ct 1); touch R toe on floor crossed in front of L ft while bouncing on L heel (ct 2). Moving in RLOD, step R (meas 2, ct 1); step L next to R (ct &); step R (ct 2). Repeat with opp ftwk but still moving in RLOD. Gallopade (2 to meas): Large step to side (ct 1), close with other ft taking wt (ct &); repeat exactly for cts 2, &. Danced on balls of ft. Hands do not swing fwd and back.

The recommended sequence of Figures is given at the end of the description.

Measures

2/4 meter

PATTERN

INTRODUCTION None.

- I **DVOJPOLKA** (Instrumental)
- Dance 4 Dvojpolka steps moving in RLOD, starting with bounce on L heel and R heel fwd on 1-8 floor.

Note: To make an Introduction, begin dance with meas 3.

- II. GALLOPADE (Instrumental)
- Facing ctr, starting with R ft and moving in LOD, dance 7 Gallopade steps; on meas 4, ct 2, 1-4 stamp with L ft (no wt).
 - Repeat meas 1-4 with opp ftwk and direction. 5-8
 - III. IN AND OUT WALK (Vocal)
- Facing slightly left of ctr, take 7 steps in RLOD (2 per meas), beginning with R stepping twd ctr B 1-4 in front of L (ct 1), step out and fwd on L (ct 2). Joined hands swing fwd on ct 1 of each meas

and bkwd on ct 2. On meas 4, ct 2 face ctr and touch L ft to L side (no wt).

- 5-8 Repeat meas 1-4 with opp ftwk and direction, starting with L across in front of R.
 - IV. TO CENTER AND BACK; STAMPS (Vocal)
- B 1-2 Walk 3 steps in twd ctr (cts 1,2,1), starting with R ft and bring straight arms up to shldr level; on meas 2, ct 2 close L to R with stamp (no wt).
 - 3-4 Repeat meas 1-2 backing away from ctr starting with L ft and lowering arms to sides.
 - 5-6 Still facing ctr, step to R on R ft (ct 1); close L to R, no wt (ct 2). Repeat with opp ftwk and direction.
 - 7-8 Stamp R, L, R (cts 1, &, 2), hold (ct &). Stamp L with wt (ct 1), stamp R, no wt (ct 2).
 - V. FINALE (Instrumental)
- A 1-6 Repeat Fig I, meas 1-6.
 - 7-8 Stamp L, R, L (cts 1, &, 2), hold (ct &). Stamp R with wt (ct 1), stamp L (ct 2).

The A musical motif is instrumental only while the B motif is vocal. The lyrics for the B music (given below) are arranged such that verse 1 is followed by the chorus and verse 2 is followed by the chorus twice the first time through the dance, while verses 3 and 4 are sung instead the second time through. The following sequence of figures fits the music appropriately.

A I, II, I
B III, IV, III, IV, IV
Repeat from beginning.
A I, II, V (finale)

- Lyrics: 1) Vdávala se Andulička, vzala sobě Pepíka, vařila mu sladkou kaši a on jí spad do mlíka.
 - 2) Vdávala se Mariánka, vzala sobě Kašpará, trápila ho, soužila ho, vydržel jí do jara.
 - 3) Oženil se náš Lojzíček, vzal si ženu Kačenu, divili se všichni lidé, co si to vzal za ženu.
 - 4) Oženil se náš Honzíček, vzal si ženu Marušku, vousy má až na kolena k tomu dceru Barušku.

Chorus: Tra-la-li, tra-la-la, tra-la-la, la-la-la, tra-la-li, tra-la-la, tra-la-la, la.

(Andulička married Pepík; she cooked him sweet porridge and he fell in the milk.)
(Mariánka married Kašpar; she annoyed him, she harrassed him; he endured this only 'til spring.)
(Lojzíček married Kačena; everyone wondered what kind of a woman he married.)
(Honzíček married Maruška; she had hairy knees and her daughter Baruška did too.)

Gjuševska Râčenica

Bulgaria (Šop)

Gjuševska Râčenica (gyoo-SHEV-skah ruh-cheh-KNEE-tsah) was learned by Yves Moreau in Sofia during the summer of 1966 from Nasko Vassilev, director of a dance group from the village of Gjuševo on the Bulgarian-Serbian border near Kjustendil. The dance is related to others of southern Šop, including Kjustendilska Râčenica, Kopčeto, and Radomirsko. It was taught by Yves Moreau at the 1968 and 1983 Kolo Festivals.

Record:

XOPO X-318-B (45 rpm)

Rhythm:

Meter: 7/16 = 2/16 + 2/16 + 3/16, counted here as 1,2,3 or Q,Q,S.

Formation:

Short lines, mixed or segregated, facing RLOD with belt hold or hands joined down in V-pos.

Styling:

The Sop people are very proud by nature. Although their dance movements are firm and sharp, the dances retain a somewhat heavy character. The upper body is upright straight most of the time, but there are occasional bends. Head movements often accompany the intricate footwork.

Measures

7/16 meter

Pattern

INTRODUCTION none.

I. TRAVELING IN LOD

- Facing RLOD, hop on L while moving R leg in a reverse bicycling motion (ct 1); step bkwd onto R (ct 2); step bkwd onto L (ct 3).
- 2 Repeat meas 1.
- Turning to face ctr, step to R on R (ct 1); step on L in front of R (ct 2); small step on R to R (ct 3).
- Still facing ctr, step on L ft behind R (ct 1); step on R to R (ct 2); step on L in front of R (ct 3).
- 5 Step on R to R (ct 1); step on L behind R (ct 2); step on R to R (ct 3).
- Hop on R, bringing L leg, with knee bent, fwd across R in a CW motion (ct 1); step L, R in place (cts 2,3).
- 7 Repeat meas 6.
- While turning to face RLOD, step L, R in place (cts 1,2); take a small step on L in RLOD with a marked knee bend (ct $\underline{3}$).
- 9-16 Repeat meas 1-8, except that meas 16 is danced facing center.

II. TOUCH AND CROSS WITH BEND, MOVING FORWARD AND BACKWARD

- Facing ctr, bounce twice on L ft, touching ball of R ft slightly R and fwd (cts 1,2); step sharply onto R ft across in front of L with marked knee bend (ct 3).
- 2 Repeat meas 1 with opp ftwk.
- 3-4 Repeat meas 1-2.
- 5-8 Repeat meas 1-4, but step and move bkwd.
- 9-16 Repeat meas 1-8. End facing slightly R of ctr with R ft next to L calf.

III. SIDE KICKS AND SCISSORS

- Hopping on L and raising R knee, kick R ft fwd R while leaning slightly away from kicking ft (cts 1-2); hop on L, bending R knee and bringing R ft behind L calf (ct <u>3</u>).
- Turning to face slightly L of ctr, step R,L in place (cts 1-2); step on R across in front of L with marked knee bend (ct $\underline{3}$).
- 3-4 Repeat meas 1-2 with opp ftwk and direction.
- 5-7 Repeat meas 1-3.
- 8 Step L, R, L in place to end facing ctr (cts 1-3).
- 9 Small step on R to R (ct 1); step on L in front of R (ct 2); step on R in place (ct <u>3</u>).
- Repeat meas 9 with opp ftwk.
- Large step fwd on R (cts 1-2); hop on R, raising L leg with bent knee fwd and high across R (ct <u>3</u>).
- Repeat meas 11 with opp ftwk.
- 13-14 Repeat meas 9-10.
- With upper body bent fwd, wt on L ft and R ft extended low fwd, dance three sharp, low scissors steps, R,L,R (cts 1-3).
- Repeat meas 15 with opposite ftwk.

IV. HEEL TOUCH, CROSS STEPS, AND MOVE BACKWARD

- Facing ctr, hop on L, simultaneously touching R heel diag R fwd (ct 1); hold (ct 2); hop on L, bringing R ft up in front of L shin (ct <u>3</u>).
- 2 Hop on L (ct 1); step on R to R (ct 2); step sharply onto L in front of R (ct <u>3</u>).
- 3 Step on R slightly behind L (ct 1); step on L to L (ct 2); step onto R in front of L (ct <u>3</u>).
- 4-6 Repeat meas 1-3 with opp ftwk and direction.
- 7 Repeat meas 1.
- 8 Bounce three times in place on both ft (cts 1,2,3).
- 9-12 Repeat Figure II, meas 5-8.
- 13-15 Repeat meas 1-3, but end facing RLOD.
- Facing RLOD, bounce three times with ft together.

SEQUENCE: Dance pattern as written three times; then dance Figure I once.

Let's Dance, March 2002

- 1. An individual is eligible for only one Federation scholarship in a lifetime.
- 2. A candidate must be a Federation Associate Member dancing with a Federation club. Also acceptable is a student who is dancing with a dance group.
- 3. A candidate 17 years or younger must have a parent or guardian sign the release at the bottom of the application.
- 4. Applications must be received by March 15.
- 5. Personal interviews are at the discretion of the Committee.
- 6. After attending Camp, the scholarship recipient will be asked to submit to the Scholarship Committee an evaluation of his experience.

Scholarships pays for 50% of the registration fee for one week at the Stockton Folk Dance Camp and is paid to the Stockton Folk Dance Camp.
