FROM THE KITCHEN

People have asked for the recipe on my Tamale Pie Casserole. NOTE: I very seldom use recipes and add ingredients to those I do see, per my own taste.

INGREDIENTS NEEDED: Large cast iron skillet, 1 lb. hamburger, 1 onion, 1 pkg. Lawry's Enchilada Mix, 1 can cream corn, 1 can pitted olives, garlic (to taste), 1 1/4 cups yellow corn meal, 1 can evaporated milk, 1 can tomatoes, 1 can tomato sauce, salt & pepper.

Brown together hamburger, onions, garlic in skillet. When done, add tomatoes and tomato sauce. While this is simmering mix the pkg. of enchilada sauce mix in a 4-cup measuring cup. Slowly add water to make a thin paste. Combine this mixture with the hamburger, etc. Continue simmering.

In a large pot, add 1 cup water, 1 can evaporated milk, 1 1/4 cups corn meal, 1/2 tsp. salt. Cook until thickened. When thick, add above contents to corn meal. Add olives. I add approx. 3/4 cup hot salsa to the mixture. Place in large casserole dish. Cover with shredded cheddar cheese. Bake in oven at 400 degrees for approx. 40 minutes, until cheese is melted.

FESTIVAL OF THE OAKS RETURNS TO OAKLAND

For fifty years the FESTIVAL OF THE OAKS was held every year in Oakland. Many of us remember when the Oakland Auditorium was the venue and that large hall was filled with lovely costumed dancers that entertained the crowds of local spectators in the galleries. As numbers of dancers and clubs diminished this event moved to high school gyms, then to recreation centers. When the East Bay Council shrunk and disbanded, Max Horn, who was the last president, single-handedly continued the tradition of staging the Festival of the Oaks until 1998. That year Max announced that it would be the last year and there would be no more festivals.

Mel Mann, a member of Berkeley Folk Dancers, saddened at this loss, proposed to the Berkeley Folk Dance executive committee that they continue this tradition. He volunteered to chair a committee to put on this event. For the past five years a loyal group of workers, Sara Mathews, Lila Witt, Carol Wong, Kazue Granich, Marge Trevorrow, Jacque Ensign and Esther Mosse have succeeded in making each year a better event in Berkeley.

For February 2003 this festival will return to Oakland. The main reason for the change is that the hall that was used for the past four years is closed for earthquake retrofitting and it became necessary to find a new location.

This year's festival will be very special in many ways. It will be held at and co-sponsored by Laney College in downtown Oakland. The committee is working cooperatively with Danny Nguyen, the chairman of that college's dance department. He is a very talented dancer and choreographer and the leader of several performing groups. The exhibition dance intermission will feature dances by him, and his groups. Carol Hirsh from Santa Rosa will lead the morning workshop. Carol teaches dance at Santa Rosa College. Students, staff and faculty from all four of the Peralta Colleges will be our guests at this event and it is hoped that we can arouse in them some interest in folk dancing.

Mark your calendar now to be sure to attend this wonderful event. Laney College is located at 900 Fallon Street which is only one block from the Lake Merrit BART station. Parking is available in both the BART parking lot and at the Civic Auditorium parking lot across from the college. See the flyer attached to this issue. Come join us and help make our guests welcome and share the joy of dancing with them.



MORRIS JEROME, CHAIRMAN, FEDERATION SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

Dear Federation Scholarship Committee:

As I sift through my memories of those wonderful days in June, I remember when I first received the letter in the mail confirming that I would receive the scholarship to go to dance camp. I was extremely excited and jumped for joy because I knew that my going on the trip depended on that scholarship. Even though I was happy and thankful, I was also a little nervous. I had never been to a summer camp before so I didn't know what to expect. Would I like the food? Would the people be nice? Would I like the rooms we stayed in? These were just a few of the questions going through my head before I left for camp. On the other hand, I was very anxious to go because I was told that at camp you learn a lot of new dances, you get to stay up as late as you want, and you make a lot of new friends. All of this seemed like paradise to me. So, I thought to myself, why be worried?

The day to go to dance camp finally came and I was very nervous. When we arrived at dance camp everything seemed to go smoothly. We got our room keys and our meal tickets, found our rooms and got settled. We explored the campus and talked while we waited for more people to arrive. As the people came, I was greeted with many welcoming faces. Everybody seemed very friendly and in good spirits. By the evening most of the people had arrived and we found the rest of our friends. We ate some dinner and went to the after party. It was there that I met most of the people that I shared this wonderful week with and everybody was just as anxious as I was to start off the week. That first night was mostly spent exploring things and seeing how everything worked at camp. I stayed up for the whole party and even went to the "Hole in the Wall." It was early morning before I staggered up to bed.

A couple of hours later I woke up to start my first lessons of the week but first I had to eat a good breakfast. I was a little worried at first because sometimes I can be picky when it comes to food but when my friends and I got the cafeteria we saw that there was a big variety to choose from. I ate breakfast and went to my classes.

By the end of the day I had met all the teachers and made lots of new friends. I couldn't wait to practice all the new dances I had learned. That night I was further introduced to the Bulgarian dance teacher, Iliana. I remembered going to her class that day but I didn't get to really meet her so I was happy to have a second chance. Whenever I had free time I would catch up on sleep or help Iliana prepare for the wedding. It was like heaven on earth. I never wanted to leave.

That Sunday I got very sad because I knew that it was time to go home but I was also very preoccupied with the wedding presentation. The big day had finally come and as I got ready to be wed I also got very nervous. I have always had stage fright and this was going to be the biggest thing I had ever done in front of people. I wanted to make sure I did everything right because I knew that this was such a big event. It took me about five minutes after the wedding started to get comfortable and when I did I enjoyed every moment of it. After the wedding ended I knew it was the most wonderful thing I had ever experienced in my life. As I looked around I saw how happy everyone was.

Letters to the Editor

Dear Editor:

I wrote a letter to the Editor of Let's Dance around 1975, part of which went something like this.

I am very much concerned about the future of folk dancing. The average age of most of the folk dancers is about 60. Unless we can get younger people involved, we may expect a rather sharp decline in folk dancing.

I have a daughter, about 11 years old, and a son 15 years old. My wife and I, along with them, have been going folk dancing to a class, which has other parents and their kids also attending. This class is just about ready to fold, one reason being the instructor is trying to teach dances beyond the capacity of the dancers.

It is now February, 2003. The average age of many folk dancers is now approaching 75. Since 1975 there has been a decline in folk dancing. The class we went to in 1975 did fold up, even after we told the teacher that she was introducing dances beyond the capacity of those attending, that we went to her class because it was a family group and we wanted to get our children interested in folk dancing.

This person was introducing Somewhere My Love, Driesteyrer, Polharrow Burn and similar advanced dances. This group lasted less than a year after trying to teach such dances.

About 1952 we went to a beginner class (which had been going on for about two years) taught by Lawton Harris (the founder of the Folk Dance Camp in Stockton.) Mr. Harris started to teach Skaters Waltz. The more advanced dancers and those who had danced for a long time pleaded with him to stop teaching such a hard dance and warned him he would lose dancers. Mr. Harris finally stopped AFTER HE LOST ABOUT HALF OF THE CLASS. This class had at the start about 100 dancers, most between the ages of 20 and 30.

Around 1962 I was the President of the Kalico Kutters, the largest folk dance group in Stockton. The teacher, Bee Mitchell (a wonderful teacher who I admired very much) began to teach La Golandrina. This dance has a reverse waltz, which few could do. Over half that group was sitting out. I, along with some others, had the hard job of telling the teacher that the dance was too hard for the group. She complied with our request and stopped teaching the dance.

The foregoing are some instances in which teaching a dance too difficult for the dancers is one of the reasons many potential folk dancers drop out. There are other reasons, also. Perhaps you can think of them. We also need solutions to these problems. This is a beginning
