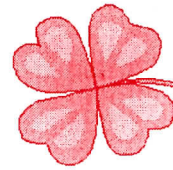

As of this printing I am not aware of a nominee for Vice President for the upcoming year. I am hoping that by the 16th of February that we will have that information available along with nominations for the President and Treasurer positions.

May is coming up and you'll notice that there is some information in this issue regarding Statewide 2003. Nadine and I are looking forward to attending this function. It sounds like it's going to be a real hoot with all the planning going on by those in charge.

Nadine and I have had difficulties with our local post office regarding the sorting and mailing procedures for Let's Dance Magazine. For the past five months we have tried diligently to follow the instructions provided by the post office, spending hours at our home labeling, separating, sorting by ZIP code, etc., taking the magazines to the post office, only to be informed each time that it was done incorrectly. A mailing house in North Sacramento is now handling this for approximately one-third of the price charged by the former mailing house. This company uses a bar code on the label which should help speed up the mailing/delivery part of things. This change took effect with February's issue.

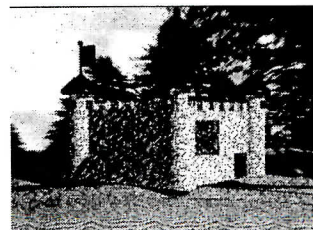

CANDIDATE REQUIREMENTS

1. An individual is eligible for only one Federation scholarship in a lifetime.
2. A candidate must be a Federation Associate Member and dancing with a Federation club. Also acceptable is a student who is dancing with a dance group.
3. A candidate 17 years or younger must have a parent or guardian sign the release at the bottom.
4. Applications must be received by March 15.
5. Personal interviews are at the discretion of the Committee.
6. After attending Camp, the scholarship recipient will be asked to submit to the Scholarship Committee an evaluation of his/her experience. Also the recipient may be asked to assist at some Federation activities in the future.

Scholarships pay the tuition portion of the registration fee for one week at the Stockton Folk Dance Camp and are paid to the Stockton Folk Dance Camp.
