Minutes of April 21 and April 28, 1968

Communications

Bill received a letter from Harriet Clasbeek officially asking that Reno's Movember 9-10 Festival be placed on the Calendar of Events. He also read an excerpt from an article in Sets In Order, the official magazine of square dancing, that discussed folk dancing on international postage stamps and complimented Let's Dance Magazine's coverage of the subject.

Vice-president - Jules DiCicco Jules announced he is ending his two years as Vice-president and chairman of the Council Presidents' Committee. He thanked the Council Presidents and wished them well under Ernie Drescher's leadership.

Jules summarized his two years' work and was applauded by the Assembly.

Jules then announced that the post office box was inaccessible due to locked doors (which he had been assured would not be locked!) with the ballots still inside! It was announced ballots could be counted next Saturday (May 18) at the Statewide Meeting to be held at 1:00 at the Dimond Recreation Center. Lawrence Jerue made a motion that this be done. It was seconded by Bruce Mitchell and passed by the Assembly. The results were asked to be shown in this set of minutes. The committee was asked to check for duplicate ballots. The question of the Circle-Square ballot not being received and another ballot sent, was brought up. Bill emphasized that addresses of clubs must be kept current. When officers are changed, altogether too often club mail is mislaid. He again suggested a post office box be used by clubs.

The responsibility for counting the ballots for by-laws changes was given to the Election Committee.

Statewide '68 - Jules Di Cicco

Jules reminded the Assembly the budget for Statewide was first discussed here in Stockton about a year ago. He commented the City of Oakland has helped beautifully, helping us to stay within that budget. As of May 7, 115 people are registered for the Brunch, and 131 people

are registered for the Institute. Carolyn Riedeman is asking that preregistration not be delayed to the last minute. The deadline date has been extended to May 20. Jules reminded the Assembly that preregistering prevents standing in lines and waiting.

Bob Williams and Suzy Martine met with the Alameda Times-Star, the Fremont Herald News, and a third associated paper for a 12 page feature story for Statewide, to be printed on June 1, the day of the Concert. Bill asked that 200-300 be purchased for the Federation's

Jules announced the Statewide programs will be ready on May 15 and thanked Vi Dexheimer for her wonderful job. She was applauded by the Assembly.
