<u>Festivals</u> were held in Sonoma, Fresno, Redwood City, Oakland, Sacramento, and San Francisco. There were seven Federation Festivals. Two of them were held in Sonoma.

Board Meetings were held at the home of Genevieve Pereira with the exception of one meeting to approve the Statewide budget. It was held at the Veterans Memorial in Sonoma. There was a total of five Executive Board meetings.

Assembly Meetings were held prior to each of the festivals for a total of seven meetings. All of our meetings seemed to be constructive and pleasant. In the future there will be no Assembly Meeting at the January festival.

<u>Committees</u> all continue to function as planned with the exception of the Calendar Committee. Due to lack of cooperation, it was decided not to publish a calendar for 1996.

Membership increased during the year. Seven clubs and eighteen associate members were added.

<u>Internet</u> identity was established for the Federation by Joel and Barbara Bruxvoort. There is now a Federation Website.

By-Laws Committee met several times and is prepared to present a report to the Executive Board.

REPORT OF HISTORIAN FOLK DANCE FEDERATION OF CALIFORNIA, INC.

Since my re-election as Historian for the 1995-1996 fiscal year, have I attended the Statewide Festival at Ojai, the Fiesta De Sonoma at Sonoma, the Treasurer's Ball at Sonoma, the Festival of the Oaks at Oakland, the Blossom Festival at San Francisco, and the Statewide Festival at San Francisco. I was provided photographs by Carlos Ruling of the Harvest Festival at Fresno, the President's Grand Ball at Sonoma, and the Camelia Festival at Sacramento, as I was unable to attend these events. My thanks are extended to Carlos for his many contributions.

Albums of photos and event programs and poster boards reflecting various events from the Federation's past, along with a framed photo collage of recent events, were displayed at the Statewide Festival in San Francisco.

In reviewing the Federation materials available for preparation of the Statewide display, I discovered gaps covering extensive periods of the 1980s and until mid-1994. Contributions of photos or other memorabilia from Federation events occuring during this period is welcomed.

The Insurance Chairman acts as liason between the Clubs of the Folk Dance Federation of CA, Inc. and the Insurance Chairman of the United Square Dancers of America.

Through the USDA insurance program all FDFC Clubs are eligible for \$1,000,000 public liability insurance and \$10,000 accidental injury secondary medical insurance. The insurance premium was \$2.90 per dancer.

For calendar 1996 there are 81 FDFC Clubs participating in this insurance program. There are 4287 dancers.

Insurance Chairman Duties

On Oct. 26, '95 we notified 81 clubs of requirements and rates for obtaining this insurance. During Nov. and Dec. we processed all insurance applications so that clubs meeting our Nov. 13 deadline were insured as of Jan. 1, '96. During Jan. and Feb. we mailed out insurance certificates; 420 have been mailed to date. In Mar. and Ap. we nagged clubs which had not yet paid their dues to the Fed. Throughout the year we provide coverage for clubs with increased memberships, with exhibitions and demonstrations to schedule, or with new venues and dance dates.

There have been two claims since our last annual report. In Sept. 195 a floor was damaged (it had been newly refinished) and the the company paid \$4500 to settle the claim. In Oct. a dancer injured a te ndon and filed an accidental injury claim.

Handling insurance monies has been expedited greatly since the Insurance Chairman deposits checks received directly into the separate insurance bank account. Duplicate copies of all deposits are given the Office Secretary and the Treasurer immediately. Copies of all monies paid out are given these two officers and to the President of the Fed.


Teachers Committee Annual Report 1995-96

During Fiscal 1995-96 there was no activity in the California Legislature relating directly to our activities except for the continued downsizing of funding for use of schools and other public buildings. The State is continuing the action of turning over activities they have traditionally funded to the counties or cities which reduces the probability of adequate funding for lack of tax revenue sources.

There have been no direct requests for information from within the Federation during this past fiscal year.

My intent is to research the possibility of establishing a simplified system of researching Legislative Activites and look further into methods of funding for nonprofit activity related functions such as the Federation.
