Millie is a past-president of the Federation, she taught folk dance classes for children as well as adults in the East Bay for decades (retired in 1987 at the age of 74), she taught at Stockton Folk Dance Camp and also ran her own Feather River Dance Camp for 25 years, she was the director of several performing groups,... I could go on and on.

Until this summer, Millie was still living alone in her home in Dublin (two stories, with a pool where she swan regularly). She recently moved to an assisted-living facility in San Ramon.

What a gal Millie is! At 98 years of age, she is still tall and stands regally when prompted to do so. She's hard of hearing, but has a strong voice, a good memory, and a feisty attitude ("Oh, her!? She was snooty, and for no good reason!"). She entertained us with stories about Buzz Glass ("He used to try out his choreographies on my dance students."), John Filcich ("John lived around the corner from me in Oakland.") and Ned and Marian Gault ("They still send me a Christmas card every year."). She remember clearly the radio program she co-hosted that was centered around folk dance music, the many folk dance performances involving hundreds of children in the Oakland Auditorium, conducting tours of Europe with her husband, and teaching at the I-House in Berkeley.

New and Returning Dancers Festival No. 2 – WHAT FUN!

Berkeley Folk Dancers in conjunction with the Folk Dance Federation of California just held a successful festival aimed at encouraging more recruits into the wonderful community of world (ethnic, folk) dance. On Saturday, September 17, we partied at Live Oak Park in Berkeley from 1 to almost 5 pm. We had at least 76 folks present, and somewhere between 17 and 31 were new dancers (our sign up efforts were imperfect). A team of 15 teachers, 8 from BFD, taught 23 simple dances representing 18 different ethnicities. There were also 8 demonstrations of more difficult dances performed by various experienced dancers in attendance. These were arranged two at a time between every set of 4 dances taught. The smiling faces and the large crowd still present after 4 hours of dancing were good signs that the festival was enjoyed.

It is always of interest to know how the participants in events like this learned about it. We asked, and got 18 answers as follows: friends (including 1 wife, 2 moms) – 11, Internet – 2, flyer – 2 (1 Ardenwood, 1 El Cerrito), Univ. Calif. e-mail – 2, and "walked by and heard the music" – 1


This festival was the second in a planned series of four such festivals to be held over a period of one year in various locations around the Bay Area. The Federation is trying to revitalize the idea of beginners' festivals by promoting a new, or at least modified, concept for these events. The plan is to focus on a party atmosphere (including refreshments), to teach lots of simple party dances, to provide a few, carefully selected, demonstrations of showy dances to inspire new recruits to continue dancing, to advertise local dance groups with their contact information, and to offer free admission. It is too soon to know if this approach will be successful, but early signs are favorable. The third festival in the series will be in Petaluma on November 6 (1-5 pm), with our editor, Gary Anderson, heading up the Organizing Committee.

The Organizing Committee for this most recent festival were Marija and David Hillis, Andy Partos, Mary Anderson, and Louise and Bill Lidicker. I want to express sincere appreciation to all of those who helped out in a multitude of ways. These efforts included a month of heavy advertising with flyers, e-mails, and persuasion, providing refreshments, helping with the teaching, and giving support with materials, funding, advice and decorations. Special mention must be made of Lucy Chang, President of the Federation, who taught two dances, shared the insights derived from Festival No. 1 (Sunnyvale), and led the Federation's support generally, and of Adony and Becky Beniares who not only taught several dances, but brought their amazing projector system for attractively displaying the program as we went along, and for bringing and hanging many national flags for decorations. Moreover, Tom Sha flawlessly ran the music, and Neil Collier (BFD President) who, with wife Judy, taught one of the dances and supported our efforts in countless ways.

It is team efforts like this that encourage us to be optimistic about the future prospects for the health and survival of the folk dance movement. Best wishes for the success of New Dancers' Festivals nos. 3 and 4.
