He introduced Ron Bueno, the General Chairman of the festival and he in turn relcomed everyone to San Jose and requested that all dancers please register in order to provide an attendance record for the City of San Jose on which to base a request for festivals in the future. All members were invited to enjoy refreshments following the meeting.

Hinutes of the Frevious Meeting - December 3, 1967

Jules DiCicco requested that the price quoted for cost of film footage for making a folk dance movie (page 5) be deleted as the comment had been facetious and not meant for the record.

Communications

1. Letter received from Blumenfeld Theatres offering discount

rates to groups of over 100 persons.

2. Letter received from Tahaiti Osasi of Japan who identified himself as a "Balkan maniac in Japan," and requested information redance descriptions and costume information. Bill pointed out that this letter demonstrates the scope of our influence by way of Let's Dance Magazine and the Costume Calendars and stressed the extent of cooperation from the Costume Committee and record dealers in accumulating information in order to answer his specific questions.

Officer Reports

Vice-President - Jules DiCicco

Jules reported that the Council Presidents Committee meeting that morning had been attended by representatives from five council areas and he introduced them as follows:

Ernie Drescher, San Francisco Dolly Schiwal, Greater East Bay Vern Mirk, Peninsula V.P. Chet Wright, Stockton Elmer Riba, Sacramento Dorothy Henney, Secretary He reported that Bee Mitchell had been invited to attend the meeting to help organize a perpetual advisory committee regarding scholarships. Four persons have accepted and one more will be appointed.

Treasurer - Bruce litchell

Bruce reported that he has not as yet heard from 24 clubs in regard to Treasurer's Ball ticket sales. Proceeds thus far are \$685 (as compared to \$689 last year) but expenses are quite different. This year's expenses have been \$157.52, leaving a \$527.48 profit so far. He felt the dance was a success, with the floor full most of the time. Bruce thanked the Vallejo area for a job well done, and reported 685 had supported the Ball financially.

Bruce announced that BYU, Gateswingers, Nodesto Folk Dancers, Oro, Santa Lucia Swingers, Sunnyside, Swinging Circle, Triple S, Vallejo Folk Dancers, Walnut Whirlers and the Chinese Dance Exhibition

Group had all sold their entire complement. BYU, the farthest away, not only sold their entire complement, but were first! Bruce then distributed gifts that had not as yet been claimed.

Director of Extension - Ray Kane

Ralph and Elsa Miller, Louise Schellare, and Phyllis Wilson were

accepted as Associate Members.

Vi Dexheimer presented Jack McKay for Associate Membership. Bill reminded Ray that Barney Lutterman of Reno was going to become an Associate Member and asked that Ray follow him up.

Director of Publicity, Lanya Pavliger

Lanya reported the 3rd costume description and all dance lists have been given to Vi for publication. There will be three more costume descriptions coming. Lanya expressed concern that the descriptions are not getting to those who want and need them. Bill emphasized spreading around the costume information -- and not hoarding it. He also reminded the Assembly that duplicates are available. is also working on Statewide '68 publicity.

Director of Publications - Jim Rasella

Jim asked that the dance description volumes be stressed, especially volumes B and C. To illustrate how valuable these volumes are, he read the table of contents of one of these volumes. tioned the volumes are not for teachers only--they are for everyone. Approval for reprinting volume A-1 was asked for. Eldon Kane made a motion that 500 be reprinted. The motion was seconded by Lawrence Jerue and passed by the Assembly.

Jim also asked that calendars be distributed to the clubs, not stored away in someone's garage where they'll be forgotten. He emphasized that the costume information is invaluable, even though

1968 has already begun.

Jim closed by asking for a concerted effort of communication about publications.

Historian - Bee Mitchell

Bee asked that thanks be given to Fresno for the nice packet of newspaper clippings she recently received.

Office Secretary and Editor, Let's Dance - Vi Dexheimer

Vi announced that as of February 1, Bobby Burke would be the new office secretary. Then she announced the proceeds of the calendar thus far are \$579, enough to pay for the artwork, printing, etc. From now on, income will be profit. Bobby Burke was introduced to the Assembly as one interested in folk dancing and one who has done much to further folk dancing. Vi expressed great confidence that a good job will be done in the office.

She announced one page of the dictionary had been received. This page will be printed as part of Let's Dance, in order to save printing costs.

Business Manager, Let's Dance - Walt Dexheimer

Walt thanked San Jose for their ads and reminded the Assembly to visit the St. Clair Hotel and Garden City Restaurants during the weekend. He announced he had the printed thank you cards with him, so the folk dance patronage is recognized.

Calendar Chairman - Suzy Martine

Suzy reported she still has not received a reply to the letter to Salinas regarding the change of Federation festival from there to Stockton.

Institute Committee - Bobby Burke

Bobby announced the spring institute on February 18 at the Eagles Hall. The instructors will be Mr. Joukowsky and Ruth Ruling. April institute has been cancelled due to the Camellia Festival insti-

tute, special Hungarian institutes, and Statewide.

She reminded the Assembly of the importance of returning the questionnaire (attached to the last minutes -- December 3) so future institutes can be governed by the wishes of the dancers. Planning is underway for the Statewide institute. Teachers have been picked and will be announced when confirmed. There will be two from the Morth and one from the South.

Dance Research

Bernice Schram reported the second supplement to the dictionary had been completed. A future meeting date has not been set as yet. Bill mentioned that next year will be the 20th year for Dorothy Tamburini serving as head of the Dance Research Committee!

Costume Research

Dorothy Kvalnes was not present. Edith Grant had a display table at the Institute on Saturday in San Jose on Mexican costumes. This will be attempted at each of the Institutes from now on -- with costumes related to the dances taught. Bill asked that dancers not be afraid to ask questions.

Legislative - Lawrence Jerue Lawrence remarked it is still too early to begin "politicing!"

Scholarship Committee - Gordon Deeg

Gordon reported February 1 is the due date for scholarship applications. One has been turned in so far. The due date will not be postponed. He reminded the Assembly there is no upper age limit.

Festival Advisory Committee - Millie Von Konsky

1) The Children's Festival in the Oakland Auditorium will be January 28 from 1:30-3:30. Millie announced there will be 10 circles of children dancing!

2) The Camellia festival brochure was shown and the festival

recommended for dancers and spectators alike.

3) BYU will have its first folk dance camp this summer -- June 10 through the week. Andor Czampo will be on the faculty, and Millie wi

bo working on the elementary school program.

4) Millie reported that once again Don Jerue has been called to Reserve duty, and reported he is available for technical help and Logi cal advice with festival procedures. She recommended the Festival Procedure Manual, saying it should be kept in all clubs' libraries.

By-laws - Eldon Kane There has been no meeting as yet.

Concert - Hillie Von Konsky

Millie reported there are 28 people on her staff for the concert including Bill D'Alvy, executive coordinator; Jules DiCicco, Statewic coordinator; and herself, director. There was a meeting on the lath with reports given from 2 to 7 p.m. She remarked that many questions were raised, some of which should be answered at Jules' Statewide Lecting on February 4.

Genevieve Pereira, Millie's Concert Secretary, is making a complete report which will be duplicated. Let Millie know if you wish

to have a copy.

She reported most of the music and questionnaires are in. Perhaps there will be an ethnic German group from Los Angeles also.

Bill reminded the Assembly that this is all being done for the Federation's benefit--for the dancers. He asked that all dancers spread the word and push tickets. Adding to Jules' slogan:

4600 is our aim

Everybody buy a ticket and be glad you came.

Statewide '68 - Jules DiCicco

Jules announced his meeting on February 4 at the Dimond Recreation Center and praised his hard-working committee.

President's Report - Bill D'Alvy

Teacher Training: Bill announced that the date being aimed for is Spring, 1969. He said basics would be stressed and anyone is welcome, not just teachers. He hopes this will produce more good teachers, which are badly needed.

New Business

Bruce mentioned that at the last Executive Board Meeting, there was discussion regarding the Treasurer's Ball. The Executive Board went on record recommending that for all future money-making events, all committee members, Federation officers, and exhibition group members are expected to purchase tickets and support the event.

Cleo Baldwin of Sacramento recommended that Camellia Festival Institute tickets be purchased prior to the Camellia Festival weekend. The Festival will be March 9-10. The 14th Annual Festival begins for Sacramento on March 1, and includes many different activities. This year's theme is Fantasy of Gods. Over 20,000 people participated in last year's festival, not including spectators. Lawrence Jerue and his committee turned over 22 ads to Let's Dance from the Sacramento area and asked the Assembly to be sure and patronize these advertisers.

February 11 - Warm Up Festival in San Francisco's Kezar Barn.

10:30 - Council Presidents Reeting.

12:00 - Assembly Meeting - the report of the nominating committee will be given.

1:30 - Program begins.

This will be a combination Regional and Federation Fectival. The admission is 75¢ and will entitle the dancer to door prizes, cookies, and coffee all afternoon.

Bill announced the next Executive Board Meeting on March 24.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:10 p.m.
