Ernie reported that the Redwood Council had secured \$282.00 in Let's Dance advertising so he urged all to patronize those who had advertised.

Millie von Konsky reported that she had sent out 88 letters asking that the enclosed questionaire be completed and returned to her. The tabulated results will be used in selecting dances for a review workshop and for dances on the program for the Beginner Festival. The Review of 6-8 beginner dances will be held on Sunday, November 9, 1975 from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. at the Aahmes Temple, 3291 School St., Oakland—the same day and place as the Treasurer's Ball. There will be no charge. The Beginner Festival will be on Sunday afternoon, April 11,1976. Frank Bacher, who is handling the music for the Treasurer's Ball will also handle the music for the Workshop.

#### NEW BUSINESS

Ray Olson reported that he was not able to secure the cooperation from clubs under the sponsorship of the Recreation Departments. It was difficult to get the names of those attending the classes.


#### ANNOUNCE TENTS:
